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SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

1. The medium of instruction and examination shall be either Sanskrit or Bengali or English or Hindi.

1.1 Generally answers may be given either in Sanskrit or Bengali or English or Hindi. But, in few cases, answers must be given in Sanskrit language. In few cases use of Deva-nāgarī Script and Sanskrit language is mandatory. So, examinees must be careful in respect of the direction of the concerned question of the respective papers to answer.

2. Examinations shall be conducted at the end of each Semester as per the Academic Calendar notified by the Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University.

3. The system of evaluation shall be as follows:

3.1 Each course will carry 50 marks, of which 10 marks shall be reserved for internal assessment based on classroom participation, seminar, term courses, tests, and attendance. Any student who fails to participate in classes, seminars, term courses, tests will be debarred from appearing in the end-semester examination in the specific course and no Internal Assessment marks will be awarded. His/her Internal Assessment marks will be awarded as and when he/she attends regular classes in the course in the next applicable semester. No special classes will be conducted for him/her during other semesters.

3.2 The remaining 40 marks in each paper shall be awarded on the basis of a written examination at the end of each semester. The duration of written examination for each paper shall be two (2) hours.

3.3 Internal Assessment will not be taken for Project, Practical, Dissertation and Skill based papers.

4. Examinations for courses shall be conducted only in the respective odd and even Semesters as per the Scheme of Examinations.

PASS PERCENTAGE

Minimum marks for passing the examination in each semester shall be 40% in each paper.

REQUIREMENT OF PERCENTAGE OF ATTENDANCE TO APPEAR IN END-TERM EXAMINATION

No student shall be considered to have pursued a regular course of study unless he/she is certified by the Head of the Department of Sanskrit, Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University without attendance of 75% of the total number of lectures, tutorials and seminars, projects, practical, extension activities, cultural programs, community awareness programs, etc. conducted in each semester during his/her course of study subject to the fulfillment other conditions of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University. The decision of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University Authority will be treated as final in this regard.
