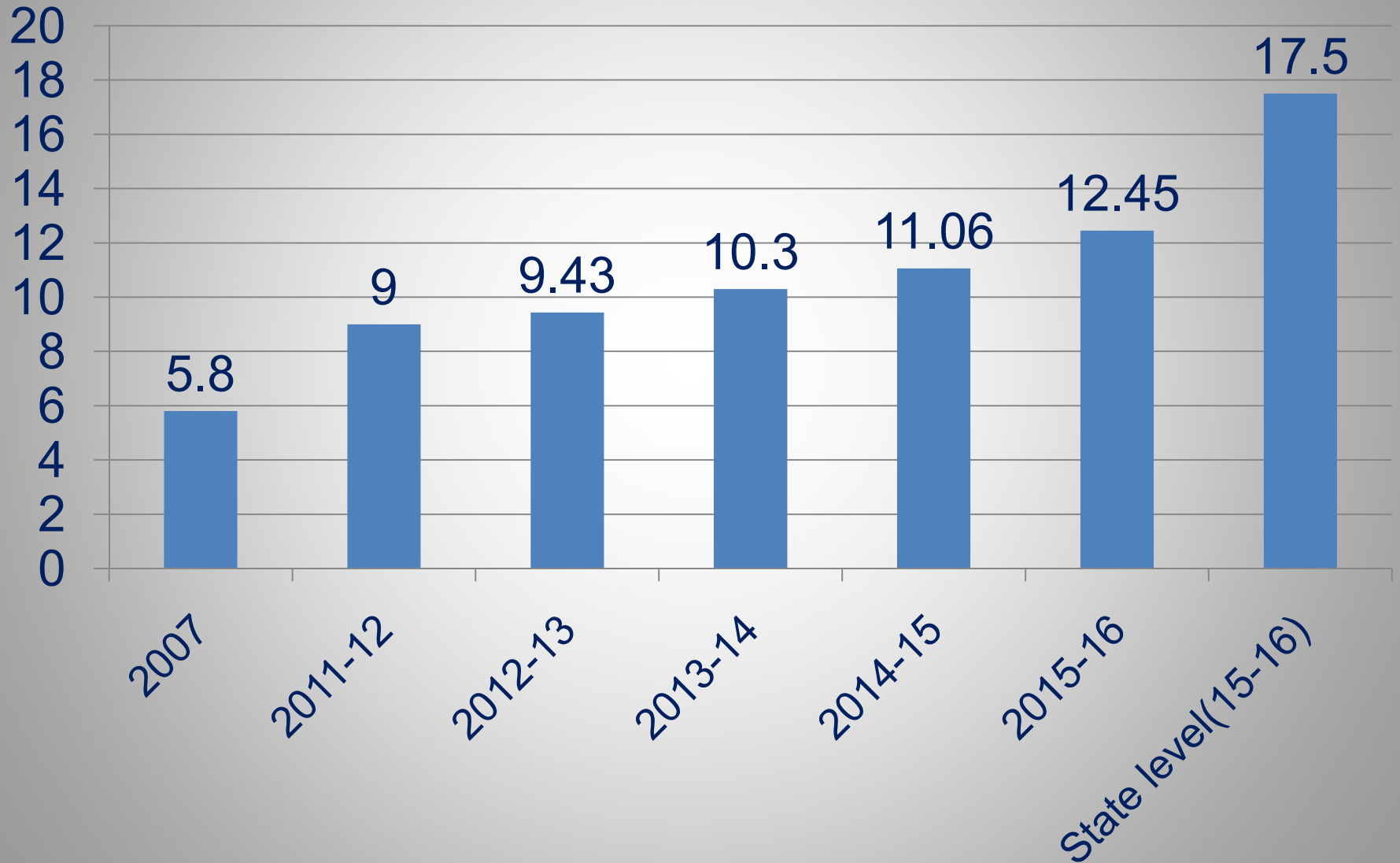
- Purulia has been incorporated within West Bengal on 1st November, 1956 (after 9 years of independence).

❖ This University has been named in memory of three tribal gallant martyrs Sidho and Kanho Murmu and Birsha Munda. The University emphasizes to uphold the local art & culture and practice of the region. Along with the celebration of National and International Days like Republic Day, Independence Day, Teachers Day, Rabindra Jayanti etc., this University celebrates other days of local/ regional importance and sentiment :

- a. Hool Festival in commemoration of Birsha Munda's call for liberation

➤ Chhau Dance:
This vibrant art of dance has been recognized as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO in 2010.

- Lac Culture: Purulia is the only district in the state where Lac insects grow in natural environment. A large section of the tribal communities depends on lac cultivation for its livelihood.

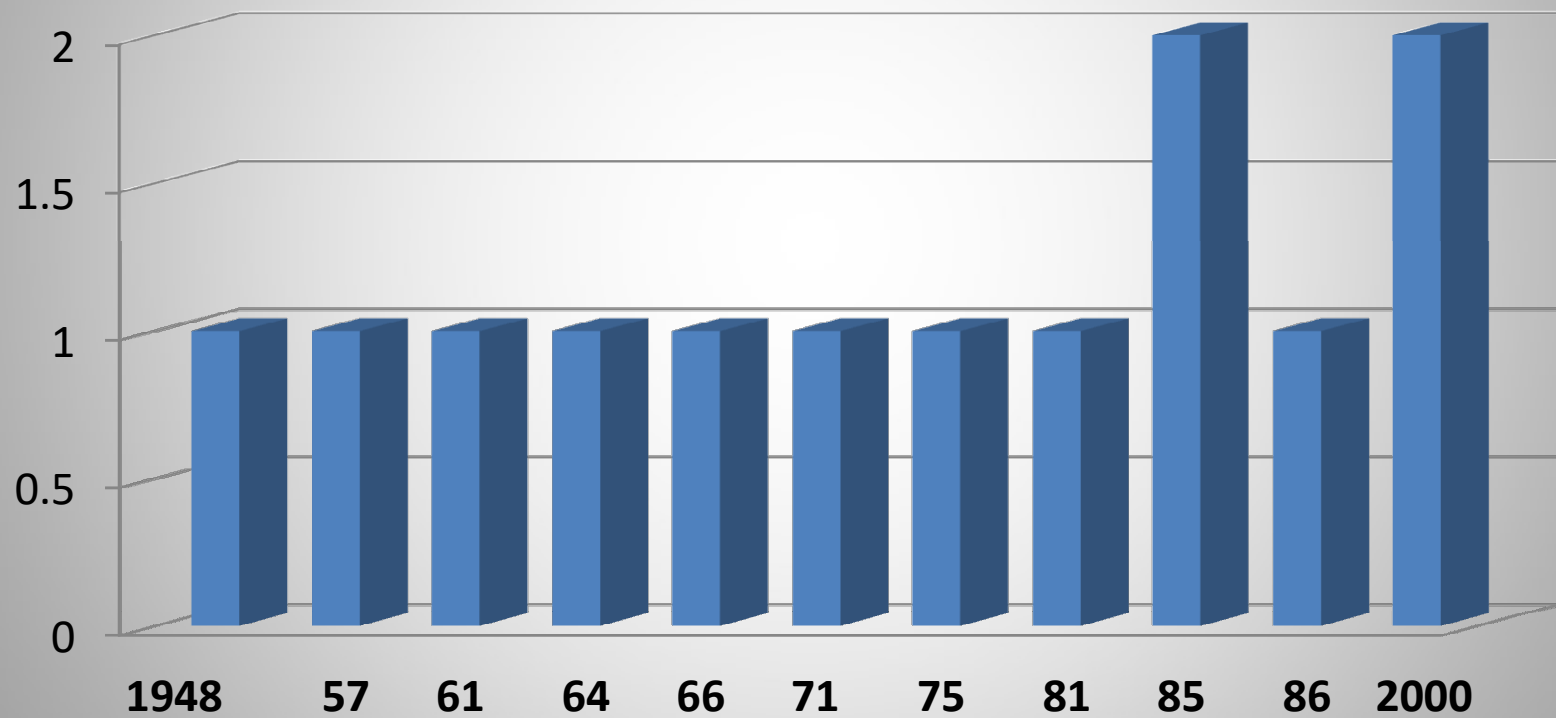
Category of the Colleges (Academic)

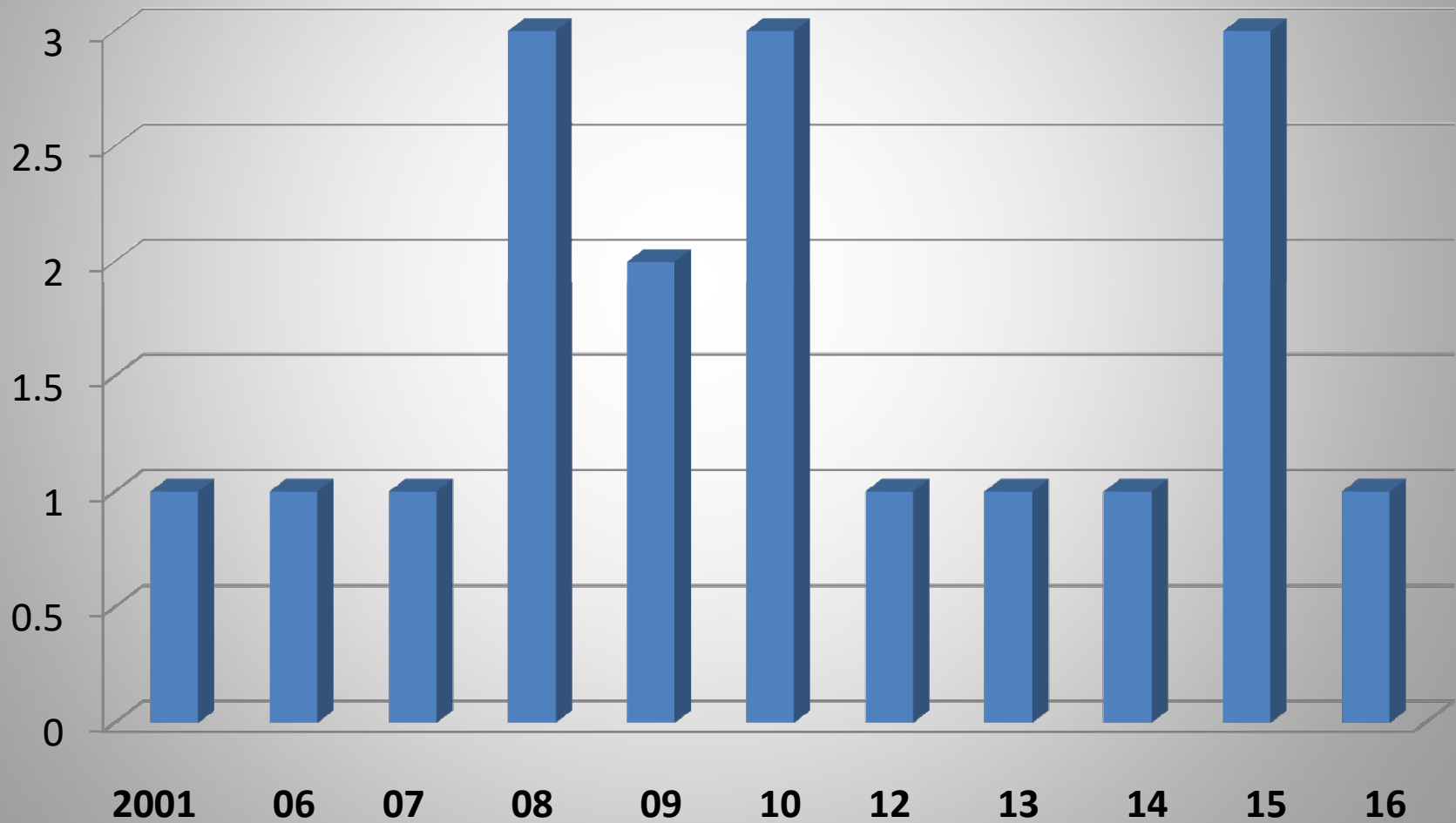
Year wise establishment of Affiliated Colleges



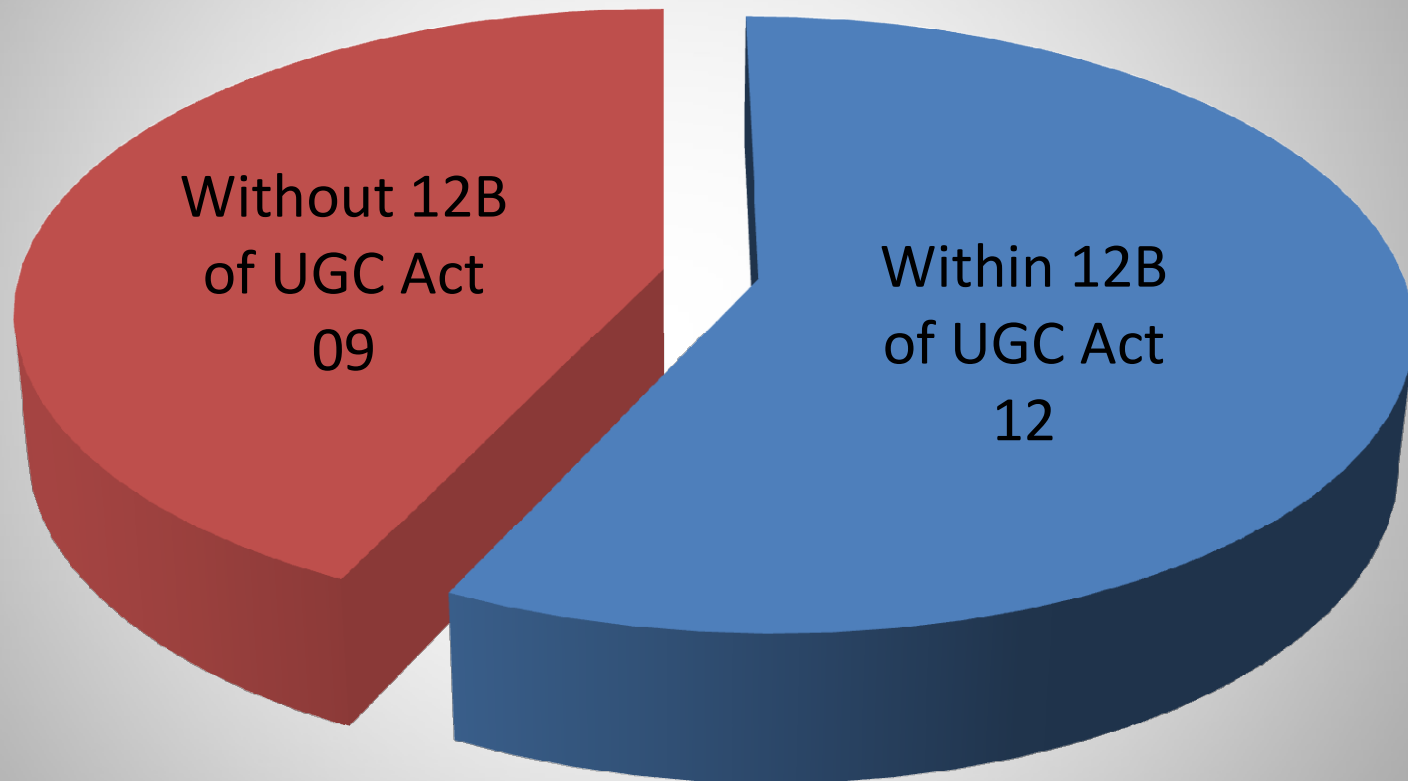
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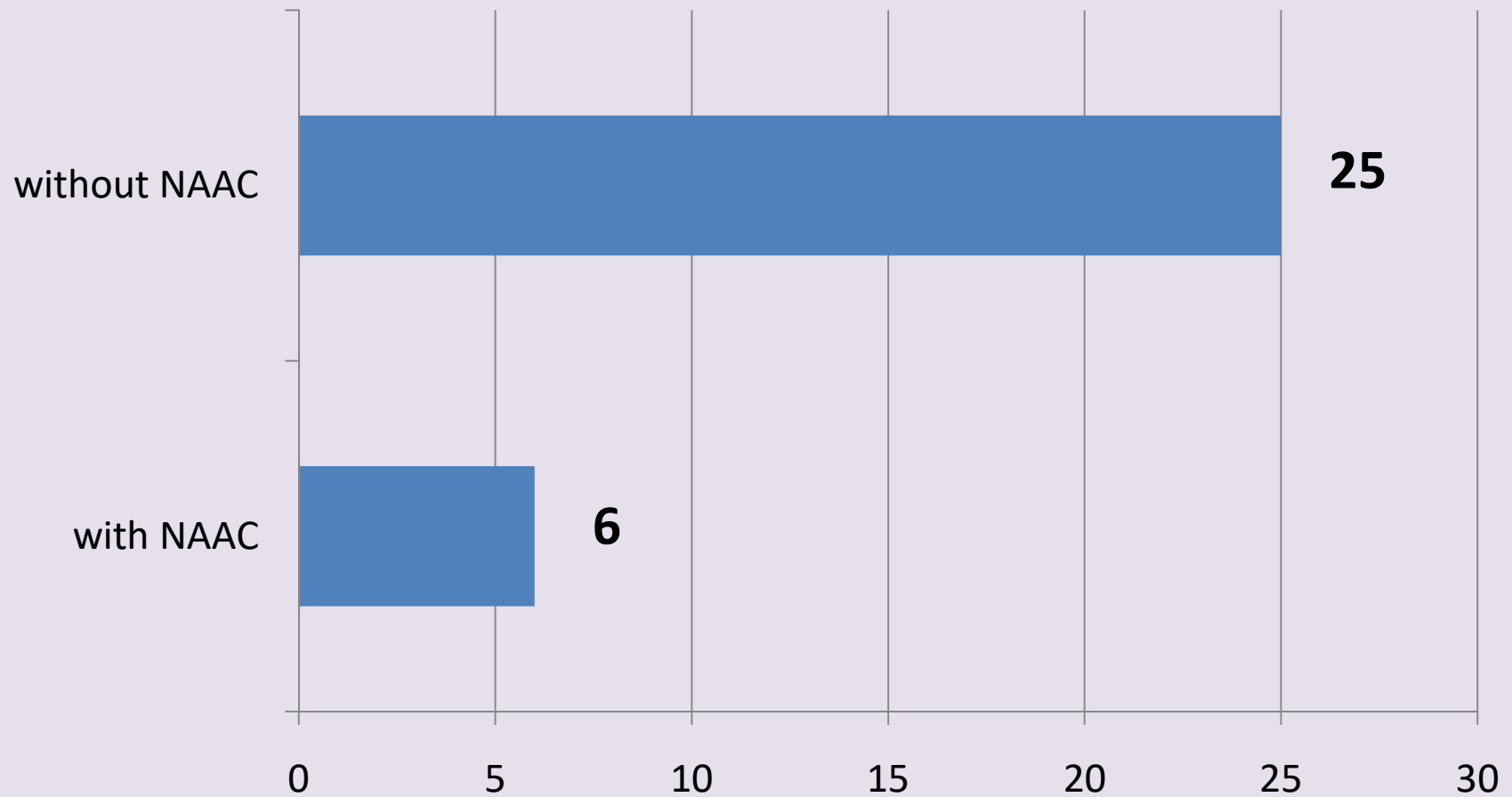
Year wise establishment of Colleges

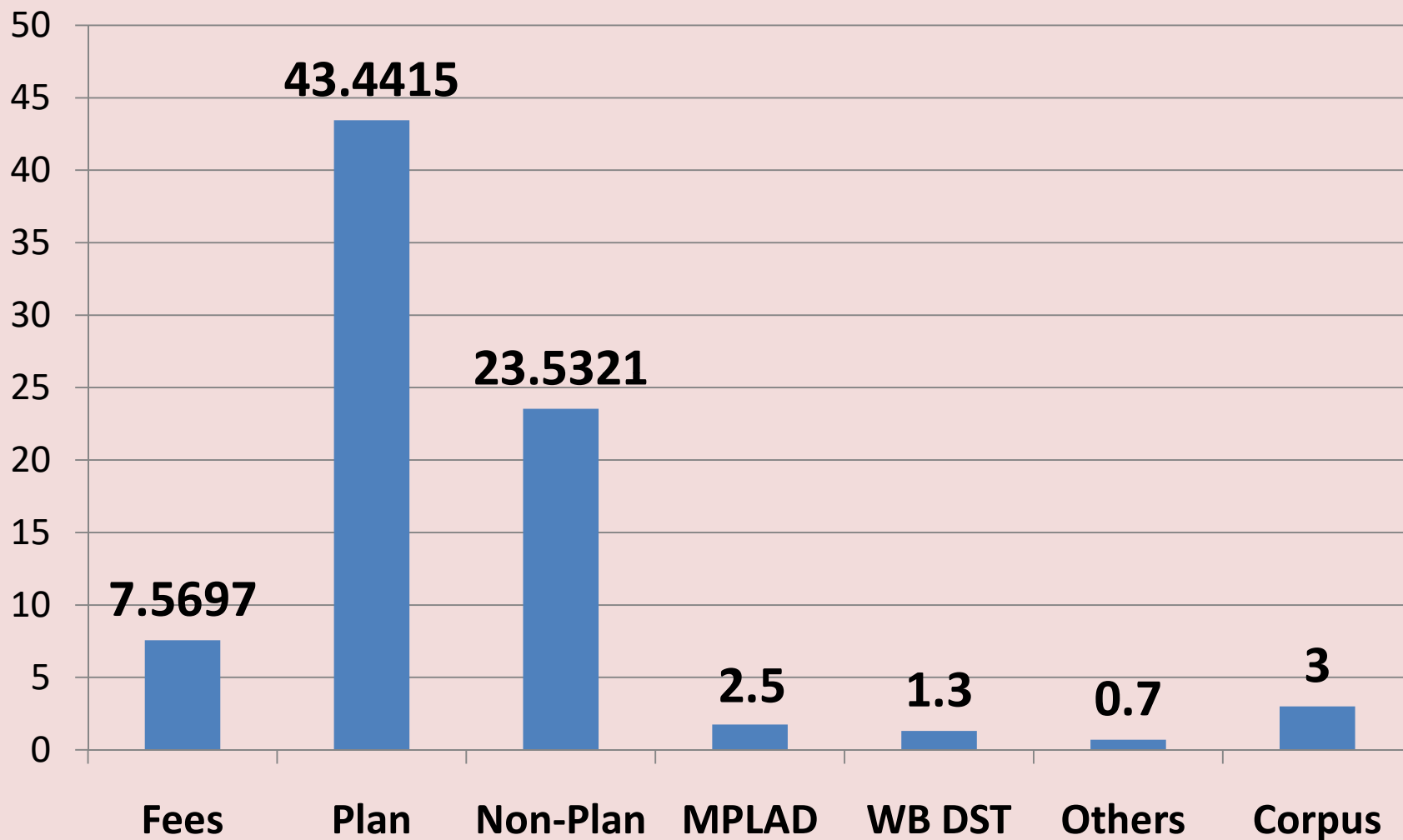
